2008 Tree Seedling Packet Information

Conifer Packet

Colorado Blue Spruce (*Picea pungens*): Best known of spruce family for hardiness & attractive color, ranging from gray-green to blue-green. Typical landscape height 30-60', 10-20' spread. Slow growing. Prefers rich, moist soil.

Douglas Fir (*Pseudotsuga menziesii*): Mature trees are 40-80' tall and 12-20' wide with short, dark green needles.

Norway Spruce (*Picea abies*): Rapid grower. Shape is conical. Has large cones. Grows best in fertile soil with ample moisture. Excellent for screenings or landscaping uses.

Scotch Pine (*Pinus sylvestris*): Narrow pyramidal form becomes more open & wide-spreading with age. Excellent as a landscape specimen. Tolerant of a wide range of soils. This tree can withstand dry conditions.

White Pine (*Pinus strobus*): This is a large conifer. Needles are always 5 to a cluster and 2 ½-5 inches long. Fast-growing; excellent choice for wind breaks.

Flowering Tree Packet

Eastern Red Bud (*Cercis canadensis*): Grows 20-30' tall and 25-35' wide. This tree has dark green leaves and pinkish purple flowers in March or April.

European Mountain Ash (*Sorbus aucuparia*): Known primarily for their colorful fruit, attractive foliage and white flowers. Needs moisture & good drainage. Prefers sun or partial shade.

Magenta Crabapple (*Malus pumilax baccata*): Grows 30' tall. This tree has dark leaves and pink flowers. The magenta crabapple does well in full sun.

Common Lilac (*Syringa vulgaris*): This irregularly outlined shrub grows 8 to 15' tall. It produces very fragrant flowers usually in May.

White Flowering Dogwood (*Cornus florida*): Popular tree, early spring flowering with striking wine-red fall foliage.

"Native to Ohio" Hardwood Tree Packet

Black Walnut (*Juglans nigra*): Oval to rounded, somewhat open crown. This tree prefers rich soils. Grows to 50-75' tall with a similar spread.

Red Oak (*Quercus rubra*): Vigorous grower. Withstands city conditions & dry, compacted soils. Full sun is desirable. Mature height up to 75'.

Ohio Buckeye (*Aesculus glabra*): The State tree of Ohio is known as a spring-summer perennial and for its fall colors. This tree prefers moist, well-drained soils of variable pH that are rich and deep, partially sunny to partially shaded conditions. Produces nuts.

White Oak (*Quercus alba*): This slow to medium growth rate tree reaches heights of 50-80' and an equal spread. It has dark green leaves and light gray bark.

Wild Black Cherry (*Prunus serotina*): Grows 50-60' tall. Has dark green leaves and gray-black bark. Poisonous to livestock when wilted.

Nut Tree Packet

American Hazelnut (*Corylus americana*): Grows 10-20' tall. The American Hazelnut has dark green leaves and produces nuts in September or October.

Black Walnut (*Juglans nigra*): Oval to rounded, somewhat open crown. Prefers rich, deep, moist soils. Grows to 50-75' tall with a similar spread.

Chinese Chestnut (*Castanea mollissima*): A rounded to broad-rounded tree, dark green leaves, and pale yellow or creamy flowers. Grows to 40-60' tall with an equal width. Likes full sun and acidic soil 5.5-6.5 pH.

Northern Pecan (*Carya illinoensis*): Pecan is a native, medium to large deciduous tree ranging from 100-140'. This tree commonly grows in rich, moist, well-drained soils that are not subject to prolonged flooding. Produces an edible nut.

Shade Tree Packet

American Sweetgum (*Liquidambar styraciflua*): Grows up to 100' tall. Sweetgum has star-shaped leaves which change to red, purple and yellow hues in autumn.

Red Maple (*Acer rubrum*): Mature height 40-60' with a spread less than or equal to its height. Has medium green leaves that can show brilliant red color in fall and prefers moist soils.

River Birch (*Betula nigra*): Grows 40-70' tall and 40-60' wide. This tree has medium to dark green leaves and light colored peeling bark.

Pin Oak (*Quercus palustris*): Native tree with fast growth up to 75'. Acorns are good wildlife food. Will tolerate wet soil.

Tulip Poplar (*Liriodendron tulipifera*): Large, fast-growing tree with tulip-shaped foliage & large flowers that appear high in tree in late spring/early summer. Bright yellow fall foliage. Prefers moist, well-drained soil, sun to partial shade.

Wildlife Packet

Black Gum (*Nyssa sylvatica*): A native tree of great ornamental and wildlife value. This tree grows on dry upland sites or on well moist, wet sites where other trees will not grow. Height 20-30'.

Red Osier Dogwood (*Cornus sericea*): Height 7-9', fast growth. White flowers in May to June. Twigs turn red for good winter color. In fall, white berries are attractive to birds.

Sargent Crabapple (*Malus sargentii*): Grows 6-8' tall and up to 12-16' wide. This crabapple has white flowers and red fruit that birds enjoy.

Common Ninebark (*Physocarpus opulifolius*): This medium coarse textured shrub grows 6-10' tall and produces whitish-pink flowers in May-June. This deciduous shrub likes full sun to part shade.

Button Bush (*Cephalanthus occidentalis*): A tall shrub common along the borders of ponds, streams

and wetlands. This shrub has attractive, medium green leaves, beautiful white flowers in late spring and bright red fruits in late summer.

Bulk Trees

Colorado Blue Spruce (*Picea pungens*): Best known in spruce family for hardiness and attractive color, ranging from gray-green to blue-green. Typical landscape height 30-60', 10-20' spread. Slow growing. Prefers rich, moist soil.

Douglas Fir (*Pseudotsuga menziesii*): Mature trees are 40-80' tall and 12-20' wide with short, dark green needles.

Fraser Fir (*Abies fraseri*): This dark green tree grows 40' tall and 25' wide. It will not tolerate hot, dry conditions.

Norway Spruce (*Picea abies*): Rapid grower. Shape is conical. Has large cones. Grows best in fertile soil with ample moisture. Excellent for screenings or landscaping uses.

White Pine (*Pinus strobus*): This is a large conifer. Needles are always 5 to a cluster and 2 ½-5 inches long. Fast-growing; excellent choice for wind breaks.

Ground Covers

English Ivy- a hardy plant with dark green leaves. Grows 6-8 inches tall. Easy to plant, does well in any soil condition and in full sun or shade. One bundle will plant 25 square feet.

Pachysandra Terminalis – a trailing, vine-type evergreen ground cover. Produces white flowers in March or early April. This plant prefers full shade and does well under trees. One bundle will plant 25 square feet.

Wildflower Seeds – plants 100-200 sq. feet. Composed of annual and perennial species that will produce an array of color in a wide variety of conditions.
